Responses to Key Questions

- Travel Document records being electronically held
 - 14 Yes (78%)
- Sharing of information on Lost and Stolen Travel Documents
 - 9 Yes (50%)
- Sharing of Lost and Stolen Travel Documents with Interpol
 - 7 yes (39%)
- Countries that face legal barriers to sharing information
 - 9 yes (50 %)



Responses to Key Questions (continued)

- Countries that face operational or policy barriers to sharing information
 - 7 yes (39%)
- Countries that have an electronic Border Management System
 - 12 yes (67%)
- Countries that have Bilateral arrangements for information sharing
 - 7 (39%)



Issues from Respondents

- Accessibility of Advance Passenger Processing both in terms of technology and cost
- Several countries expressed concerns relating to what would happen to information once it had been exchanged
 - These concerns ranged from ownership of the information through to the privacy implications of sharing information
