Agreed to an inclusive but non-binding Regional Cooperation Framework (RCF) to cooperate to reduce irregular movement through the region

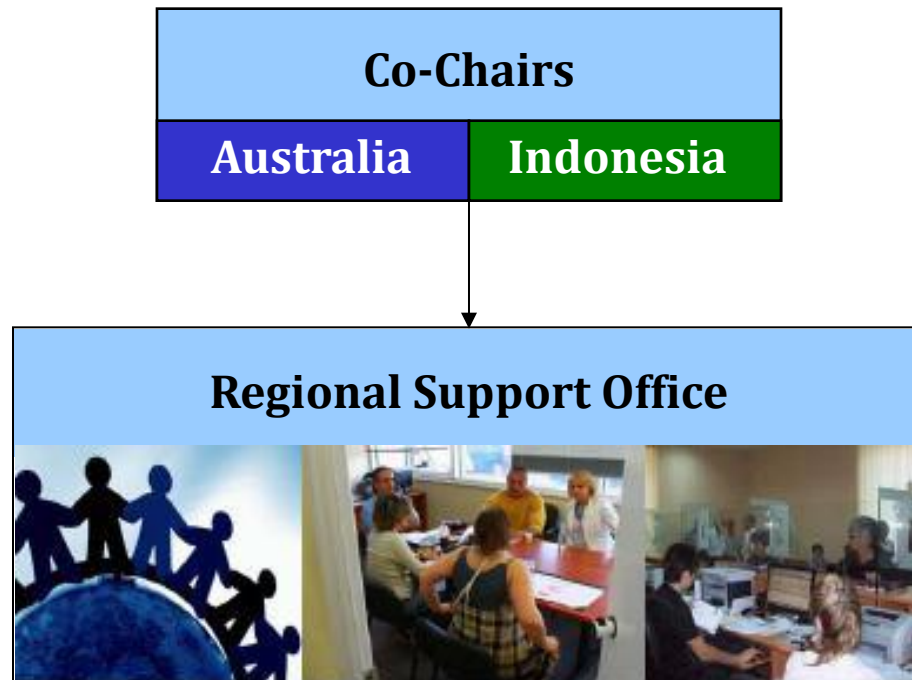

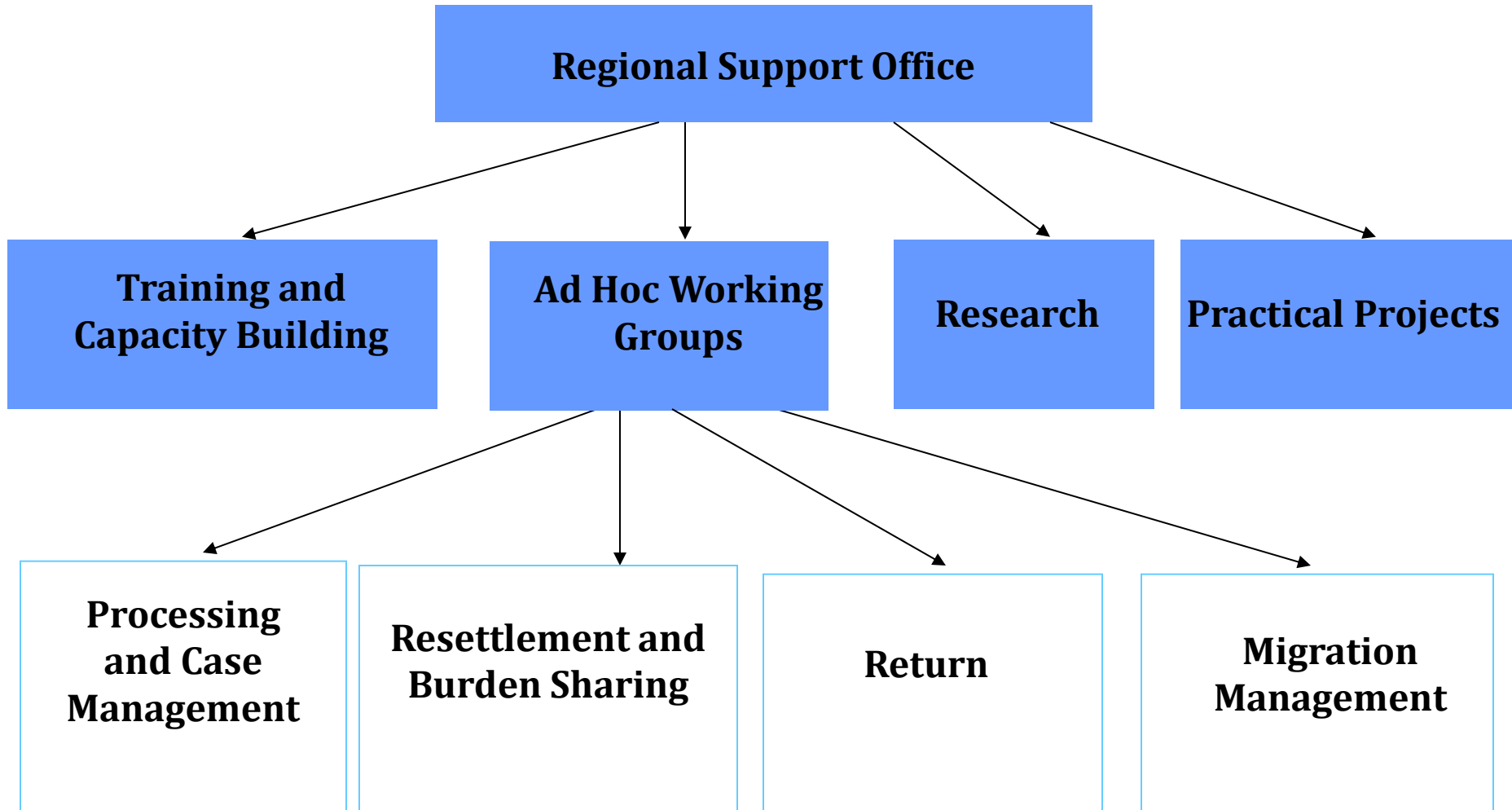
