

**Mr. Sukmo Yuwono- Co-Manager (Indonesia), the Regional Support Office of the Bali Process on People Smuggling, Trafficking in Persons & Related Transnational Crime**

Mr. Sukmo Yuwono is Deputy Chief of Mission and Deputy Permanent Representative to the UNESCAP of the Embassy of the Republic of Indonesia in Bangkok since 2021. He is also currently serving as the Indonesian Co-Manager of the Regional Support Office of the Bali Process on People Smuggling, Trafficking in Persons and Related Transnational Crime.

He has joined the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Indonesia since 1995. He was assigned to several posts in foreign countries, among others, the Indonesian Embassy in Ottawa, Canada (1999-2002), the Indonesian Consulate General in Hong Kong (2005-2010), and the Indonesian Embassy in Singapore (2013-2016). Prior to his arrival in Bangkok, he has previously served as the Head of Bureau of Law and Public Relations of Indonesian Migrant Worker Protection Agency (2019-2021).

He completed his bachelor degree in law from University of Jenderal Soedirman, Purwokerto, Central Java and master degree in business law from University of Padjadjaran, Bandung, West Java.

**Dr. Matthias Reuss - Senior Statelessness Officer, UNHCR Regional Bureau for Asia and the Pacific**

Matthias is currently working as a Senior Regional Statelessness Officer at the UNHCR Regional Bureau for Asia and the Pacific. He previously was assigned to UNHCR in South Sudan and Southern Africa. MR had also worked for various international organizations, the international judiciary, in academia, and as an advisor on international law to the German Federal Parliament. He holds a Ph.D. in international human rights law from Hamburg University.

Dr. Sriprapha Petcharamesree is currently a senior advisor to the Institute of Human Rights and Peace Studies, Mahidol University, Thailand. Between 2016-2021, she served as a senior research advisor to UNHCR (Regional). She published various publications, including papers relating to academic freedom at higher education institutions, human rights-based approach to development as well as promoting human rights and peace education in higher education institutions.

Between October 2009 to December 2012, she was appointed the Thai Representative to the ASEAN Intergovernmental Commission on Human Rights. Since 2009, she has been convener of the ASEAN University Network-Human Rights Education. She is a member of the Governing Board of the UNESCO Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Education for Peace and Sustainable Development (MGIEP).

Sheikh Mujibur Rahman ndc was the Secretary (Coordination & Reforms), Cabinet Division of Bangladesh. Prior to that position he was the Director General of Bangladesh Institute of Administration & Management (BIAM). Before that as Additional Secretary he had been serving as the Project Director of Birth and Death Registration Project under Local Government Division, Ministry of Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperatives of Bangladesh. He was the first Registrar General, Office of the Registrar General, Birth & Death Registration under the same Ministry & Local Government Division. He worked as Joint Secretary under Ministry of Civil Aviation & Tourism, Deputy Secretary, Bridges Division under Ministry of Communications.

After obtaining Masters in Economics Mr. Rahman joined Bangladesh Civil Service on 15 February, 1988. He obtained his 2nd Masters in Business Administration. He served in the field administration for long 20 years consecutively as Assistant Commissioner & Magistrate, Upazila Magistrate, NDC, Magistrate PDB, Upajila Nirbahi Officer, Cantonment Executive Officer, Additional Deputy Commissioner, Additional District Magistrate, Acting Deputy Commissioner (DC) and holding other important positions at different Upazilas & Districts of Bangladesh.

After joining Bangladesh Civil Service, he has successfully completed all basic training courses designed for the members of Bangladesh Civil Service (Administrative Cadre) He has also attended some special courses on Project Management, Prevention of Corruption, Disaster Management, Public Procurement and other topics. Moreover, he has successfully completed some advanced courses like Managing of the Top (MATT), Advance Courses on Administration & Development (ACAD), Senior Staff Course (SSC), Policy, Planning & Management Course (PPMC) & National Defense Course (NDC) etc. both in home and abroad.

As Deputy Secretary, Joint Secretary, Additional Secretary he had been serving under Ministry of Communications, Ministry of Civil Aviation & Tourism, Ministry of Local Govt, Rural Development & Cooperatives, Ministry of Public Administration. Now he is providing some consultancy services for supporting Office of the Registrar General, Birth and Death Registration on contact basis as National Consultant of UNICEF Bangladesh.
